Aims and Objectives

ST BERCHMANS COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS)

- 1 In keeping with the educational mission of the Universal Church, the Archdiocese of Changanassery founded St Berchmans College in 1922. Ever since its inception, the College has played an effective role in the sphere of higher education, with unflinching loyalty to the noblest Christian ideals, and sparing no pains to preserve the highest academic standards.
- 2 Upholding the spiritual commitment of the Church, the College seeks to build up young men and women who will strive for excellence in every field. The College aims at imparting the best formation as well as information to its students in every possible way.
- 3 The College strives to develop the spiritual, moral, intellectual, physical and aesthetic potentials of its students so that they may be good citizens useful to themselves and to society.
- 4 The College was established to give Catholic youth the benefits of higher education in a congenial Catholic environment. The College fulfills this aim, working within the framework of the rules and regulations of the Government and the University, in accordance with the rights of the Minority Communities guaranteed in the Constitution of India. It is owned and managed by the Archdiocese of Changanassery, and it caters primarily to the Catholics of the Archdiocese. The College also offers its services to members of other Christian and Non-Christian Communities.
- 5 True to the spirit of justice and equality of opportunity enshrined in the Constitution, the College tries to encourage higher education among the weaker and socially handicapped sections of the society.

►► MAJOR MILESTONES

- 1922 St Berchmans College is founded on 19th June 1922 by His Excellency Rt. Rev. Dr. Thomas Kurialacherry. Affiliated to Madras University, it starts as a Second Grade College, and is housed in the old seminary building at Parel. To begin with, the college offers only Group III of the Intermediate Course, and has on its rolls only 125 students. Rev Fr Mathew Purackal is the first Principal.
- 1925 Intermediate course groups I and II are introduced. The college is moved into the present premises.
- 1927 The college becomes First Grade, offering Botany and Zoology at the Degree level.
- 1928 BSc Mathematics is introduced
- 1934 Affiliation is granted for BA Economics
- 1937 The New Science Building with its majestic tower with the statue of Christ the King on top completed and blessed.
- 1938 Syriac and Sanskrit are offered under Part II of the degree course and Syriac for the Intermediate. Junior classes are affiliated to the newly formed University of Travancore.
- 1939 Senior classes are affiliated to the University of Travancore
- 1940 Christ the King's Chapel, the Msgr Kallarackal Hall-the first Assembly Hall on the campus-are built. St Thomas Hostel and St Joseph's Hostel are established.
- 1945 Affiliation for BSc Physics is granted. Newman Hostel is established.
- 1951 Affiliation is granted for BSc Chemistry
- 1952 His Highness Sri Chittira Tirunal visits the College
- 1956 The intermediate course is replaced by the Pre-University Course
- 1957 Three year Degree Courses commence
MA in Economics begins
- 1959 BA Malayalam Language & Literature Course is started.
- 1960 MA in Malayalam begins
- 1961 MSc in Physics and Botany are started
- 1962 Hobby Workshop and Non-Resident Students Centre (with UGC aid) are established
- 1963 B Com Course is started
- 1964 Affiliation is granted to MSc Chemistry and BA English Language and Literature.
The Pre-degree Course begins. Sahrudaya-Hostel is established.



- 1965 Affiliation is granted to MSc Mathematics and MSc Zoology.
Grand Science Exhibition and Arts Festival are organized.
- 1966 Re-organized BA, BSc and special BSc courses begin
- 1967 MA English Language and Literature is granted affiliation
The four storeyed Biology Block cum Office Complex is formally blessed.
- 1972 Golden Jubilee of the college
- 1973 The new Library Building and the three storeyed staff Quarters are blessed.
- 1974 Archbishop Kavukattu Hall is blessed
- 1975 St.Berchmans College becomes a member of the International Federation of Catholic Universities, one among the seven selected from India, and three from Kerala.
- 1977 The College is selected by the UGC as one of the lead colleges.
- 1979 The shift system is introduced for the Pre-degree course.
- 1981 Affiliation is granted for M Com
- 1982 Diamond Jubilee year
- 1983 Gandhiji University (Renamed Mahatma Gandhi University) is established and the College is affiliated to the new University.
MSc Material Science under Gandhiji University begins.
The Arts Club presents The Merchant of Venice.
- 1984 MSc Analytical Chemistry begins
- 1986 His Excellency Giani Zail Singh, the President of India, visits the college. The Departments of English, Physics, Botany and Zoology are made research centers under Mahatma Gandhi University
- 1986-87 A Grand Industrial & Science Exhibition and Arts Festival are organized in connection with the Diamond Jubilee of the Natural Science Courses and the Silver Jubilee of PG Courses
- 1991 The Research Centre is opened.
- 1992 The Executive Council meeting of the International Federation of Catholic Universities is held on the campus.
Sri. Shivaraj Patil, Hon'ble Speaker of Lok Sabha visits the college.
Scinex-92, Science and Industrial Exhibition, is held in connection with the Seventieth Jubilee Celebration of the College.
- 1994 Department of Malayalam becomes Research Centre under Mahatma Gandhi University
- 1995 Centre for Durrel Studies and Centre for Kamala Das studies are opened. Berchmans Institute of Management Studies is inaugurated.
Language Laboratory and Environmental Research Laboratory are opened.

The College starts Master's Degree in Non-Conventional Energy.
Opens a well-equipped computer lab.
Launches Bachelors Degree in Computer Applications under the aegis of Mahatma Gandhi University Distance Education.
- 1999 The college introduces the Parliamentary System of Elections to the College Union, free of political affiliations on the basis of the High Court Order.
Msc Polymer Chemistry is started.
The NAAC confers on the college the highest grade FIVE STAR Status.
- 2000 The College receives the Global Nirmithy Network (GNN) Award
- 2001 BA Vocational English(Aided) and Bsc Biotechnology & Botany (UGC sponsored) are started.
- 2002 National Environmental Studies Centre in the Dept of Chemistry (UGC sponsored) is started.
The Department of Science and Technology (DST) and the DAAD foundation of Germany, in a joint venture, recognize the Department of Chemistry as a Centre of Excellence.
Starts UGC sponsored BSc Industrial Microbiology (Dept, of Zoology), MSc Biotechnology (Dept, of Botany) and MPhil in Environmental Studies (Dept, of Chemistry)
Starts BLISc (Department of Library and Information Science)
Inaugurates the Berchmans Counselling Centre.
- 2003 HR Department is established.
Berchmans International Film Festival is conducted.
- 2004 The UGC identifies the College as a "College with Potential for Excellence".

AUTONOMY

The Government of Kerala and UGC (No.F.22-1/2014 (AC) dated 19 June 2014) granted Autonomous status to St Berchmans College in 2014 for 6 years. In 2020 the college applied for extension of autonomous status and a team deputed by UGC under the chairmanship of Prof. Dr. Anu S Lather (Vice Chancellor, Dr Ambedkar University, Delhi) visited the campus in February 2022. Based on the same the status was extended for a period of five years from session 2022-23 to 2026-27, including ex-post facto approval for the period 2020-21 to 2021-22, as per provisions of clause 3.13 and clause 6.3 of UGC Regulations dated 12.2.2018.

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ADMISSION NORMS

The admission to all programmes is governed by the following terms of agreement between the Management of the College and the Government of Kerala.

● Aided Programmes ●

- 1 Fifty percent of the seats will be filled by open selection on the basis of merit.
- 2 Ten percent of the seats will be reserved for the Catholic students of the Archdiocese of Changanassery. The seats will be filled strictly on the basis of merit.
- 3 Fifteen percent of the total number of seats shall be reserved for the students belonging to the SC category.
- 4 Five percent of the total number of seats shall be reserved for the students belonging to the ST category.
- 5 The remaining 20% seats will be filled by the Management.
- 6 One seat each in all the programmes shall be reserved for students with disabilities.
- 7 The Management of the College appoints a committee every year for the purpose of selection of students under (5) above. The committee makes the selection giving special weightage to educationally backward areas and low income groups.
- 8 The selection of the students under (1, 3 and 4) above will be governed by the Admission rules of Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam.
- 9 The selection of the students under (2) will be based on academic merit.
- 10 Two seats each in all programmes shall be reserved for students belonging to Transgender category (G.O.(Ms) No.219/2016/H.Edn dated 28.10.2016 and No. 2532/AC A1/2019/MGU dated 10.06.2019)

● Self Financing Programmes ●

- 1 50% of the total seats will be filled by the management from the registered candidates who satisfy the eligibility conditions.
- 2 The remaining seats (50%) will be filled on the basis of merit as detailed below:
 - a) 65% - Open Quota
 - b) 8% - Scheduled Caste
 - c) 2% - Scheduled Tribe
 - d) 9% - Ezhava, Thiyya&Billava
 - e) 8% - Muslims
 - f) 2% - Latin Catholics other than Anglo Indians
 - g) 1% - Other Backward Christians
 - h) 5% - Other Backward Hindus



ADMISSION GUIDELINES

- 1 Candidates have to register online through the college website for admission to various Programmes.
- 2 No student will be enrolled or allowed to attend any class until the fees due from him/her has been paid.
- 3 Any candidate who is found to have secured admission by false representations will be sent away forthwith and he/she shall forfeit whatever fees he/she has remitted.
- 4 All candidates seeking admission must present at the time of admission the transfer certificate from the school/college they last attended along with, conduct and course certificates.
- 5 Students from other universities must produce:
 - a. The migration certificate from the university under which they last studied.
 - b. Eligibility certificate from MG University, if applicable
- 6 Qualifying certificates submitted by the students on admission will be returned to them only on completion of their respective end semester examination.
- 7 SSLC certificates and other mark lists have to be claimed within a year after leaving the college. The office will not be responsible for the certificates which are not claimed within a year after the completion of the Programme.

Campus Life

The Staff, especially the Staff Council, will be in charge of ensuring discipline on the campus. The Staff Council will look into the grievances and complaints, if any, of the students and do their best to set things right. Students are, therefore, advised not to resort to any direct action or create disturbances on the campus on the pretext of any provocation. They may present their grievances in writing to the convener of the Student Affairs Committee. Any activity of the students or the staff that hinders the smooth conduct of classes and the maintenance of discipline of the college is prohibited on the campus as per the High Court Order (OP No 20110 of 1999, WP (C) No 14650 & 14655 of 2013).

Class Hours

- 1 The Working hours will be from 10:00 am to 04:00 pm with five periods of one hour duration.
- 2 The College follows day order system. Days are denoted by numbers such as 1,2,3,4 and 5 and the time table is followed accordingly.
- 3 If a minimum of 2 teaching hours do not happen on a particular day, the day will be repeated in the next working day.

GUIDELINES AND RULES OF CONDUCT

- 1 Class hours are from 10:00 am to 04:00 pm. Be in time for classes.
- 2 Ragging is a punishable offence and those who indulge in it or encourage it will be handed over to the Law as "UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009". Students in distress may call the Anti Ragging SB Convenor Mr Justin John (9447803668) and later to National Anti ragging Helpline 1800 - 180- 5522 (Toll Free) or email at helpline@antiragging.in
- 3 Maintain a calm atmosphere on the campus, especially during working hours. There should be complete silence on the corridors, veranda and on the campus during class hours. Students must not loiter on the campus during class hours.
- 4 Show respect to your teachers and elders.
- 5 Seek permission of the teacher before entering or leaving a class in session.
- 6 If classes are free during any period, engage yourself in meaningful co-curricular activities.
- 7 Do your best to preserve a peaceful academic atmosphere on the campus.
- 8 Insubordination, habitual inattention, neglect of work, unbecoming language or conduct and obscenity in word or deed render a student liable to temporary or permanent dismissal
- 9 Every student of St Berchmans College is bound to abide by the rules and regulations framed by the college authorities for a peaceful atmosphere conducive to study and maintain discipline on the campus. Violation of the rules and regulations of the college shall invite punishment amounting to the gravity of the offence.
- 10 Tobacco and chewing gum are strictly banned on the campus. Students are liable to disciplinary action if found smoking in and around the campus, in possession of, or under the influence of tobacco products, drugs or alcohol.
- 11 Courteous behaviour towards other students, especially to those of the opposite sex makes a true Berchmanite.
- 12 Public property is our property. Damage done to it is a national offence. Strict action will be taken against those who damage the instructional and infrastructural facilities available on the campus.
- 13 Students are forbidden to bring fire crackers and Holi colours to the campus. Students found doing so are liable to disciplinary action.
- 14 Do not disfigure the college furniture, walls, doors or windows with drawings, engravings or posters. Do not tamper with electrical installations.
- 15 Posters and notices must not be put up without the permission of the Principal. If permission is granted, all posters and notices should be placed on the boards kept for the purpose in different blocks and not stuck on the walls of the college.



- 16 Outsiders are not permitted to attend college functions without the permission of the principal. Strict action will be taken on those who bring outsiders to the campus.
- 17 Grievances, if any, shall be taken to the Principal through your representatives.
- 18 Addressing any gathering on the campus or students in the class can be done only with the permission of the Principal.
- 19 Campus politics, political activism, strikes, slogan shouting, processions, crowding on the campus, display of political banners and flags, and sticking notices on the wall are banned on the campus.
- 20 Students, other than hostellers, are not expected to be present on the campus after 6:00pm.
- 21 Transact business in the college office in a manner becoming of college students, patiently and politely.
- 22 Observe perfect silence during the general college morning prayer.
- 23 The medium of instruction and communication shall be English
- 24 In keeping with the circular of the Department of Higher Education, Government of Kerala, possession/use of mobiles by students in the College premises is prohibited.
- 25 Malpractices in examination will lead to necessary disciplinary action as per the regulations.

DRESS CODE

The college expects all the students to keep in mind the basic norms of modesty and decency with regard to dress. Wearing casual dress, collarless T shirts, T shirts with writings or pictures, coloured dhoties, low waist pants/jeans, torn jeans, short pants/bermuda pants, short skirts, short tops are strictly prohibited.

IDENTITY TAG

- 1 It is mandatory to wear the college identity card on campus.
- 2 ID Tag is a public document and the card should be shown to the staff or College officials when asked, especially during Examination, during formal programmes, in the administrative office and library. The denial of it invites disciplinary action. The loss of ID card should be reported to the Principal at the earliest.

CELEBRATIONS IN THE COLLEGE

- 1 Procession of any kind is not allowed.
- 2 Percussion instruments are strictly prohibited.
- 3 Public address system, if needed, can be used only within the halls with the permission of Principal. It should not create any disturbance to other departments.

- 4 Before leaving the campus after the Onam celebrations, students should clean the place of their 'pookkalam' and the respective places allotted to them for celebrations.
- 5 All celebrations should be modest.
- 6 Crackers and fireworks are not allowed.
- 7 Students except hostellers are not allowed to stay on the campus after 6:00 pm unless permitted by the Principal.
- 8 All celebrations in the college must end by 6:00 pm. Students should leave the campus by 2:00 pm after the Onam and Christmas celebrations.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

- 1 Students are expected to attend classes every day. However, if there are genuine reasons Like ill-health, students can avail leave after obtaining permission from the mentors.
- 2 Students should come to class in time before their attendance is taken. They should not leave the classroom and the late comers should not enter the class without the permission of the teacher in charge.
- 3 The University Grants Commission (UGC) has mandated a minimum of 75% attendance to write the end semester examination. College will strictly adhere to the norm as demanded by the UGC. The minimum attendance is absolutely necessary for promotion and for admission to the end semester examination.
- 4 For the purpose of attendance, all working days shall be counted as full days irrespective of the number of working hours.
- 5 The attendance shall be marked at the beginning of each class whether lecture, practical, composition or tutorial, by the teacher in charge of the class.
- 6 No student shall absent himself/herself from a class without leave. Absence without leave from part of a session shall be treated as absence for a day.
- 7 A late coming student shall lose half a day's attendance unless otherwise recommended by the teacher-in-charge of that class.
- 8 Attendance is available for students/parents to view on the College Website. Parents are requested to make use of this facility in tracking the attendance of their ward.
- 9 Students must check the attendance regularly, and if any discrepancy is found, the same should be brought to the notice of the class mentor/HoD in writing within two working days.
- 10 The name of the student will be removed from the rolls if he/she is absent continuously for more than 10 days without leave. They may be readmitted at the discretion of the Principal.
- 11 All serious cases of illness should be reported to the Principal through the guardian or the warden. In case of absence on account of illness, medical certificate may be called for.



- 12 A student who absents himself/herself from a test paper, seminar or any other assignments shall not attend the class again until he/she writes the paper or assignments and submits it to the teacher concerned. Failure to do this shall involve loss of attendance.
- 13 At the end of each semester, a list will be put up on the general notice board showing the number of days of attendance gained by each student.
- 14 Students shall diligently examine this list and see that their attendance does not fall below the minimum percentage required for the semester.
- 15 A disciplinary action will be initiated against those who repeatedly absent themselves without sufficient grounds

LEAVE

- 1 A student requiring leave for an hour for valid reasons may apply to the teacher in charge before that class begins.
- 2 If leave is required for more than one hour, the student must apply for it in the prescribed format to the Principal/HoD.
- 3 The reason for each day's absence will have to be explained and in the case of absence due to illness, a medical certificate also will have to be submitted especially if one is absent for more than five working days at a stretch.

CONDONATION OF SHORTAGE OF ATTENDANCE

- 1 Students whose attendance falls below the minimum required to write the examination shall have to apply for exemption to the Principal. The chalan receipt for Rs. 25/- shall accompany the application for exemption.
- 2 Condonation will be granted only on medical grounds.
- 3 An application for condonation, which does not fully conform to the prescribed format will be rejected.
- 4 In case of illness, the application should be supported by proper medical certificates. The medical certificate should be submitted either at the time of the treatment or immediately after the treatment (within two days)
- 5 Exemption will not be granted unless the Mentor and Head of the Department recommends it. The Mentor should also state against each period of absence whether a timely application for leave was submitted and leave granted at the time.
- 6 A student is not eligible for condonation on medical ground unless the medical certificate is submitted at due time
- 7 The Principal may grant condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10 days in a semester subject to a maximum of 2 times during the whole period of the programme.
- 8 It is the duty of the student to enquire whether his/her application for leave has been sanctioned.

OTHER DUTY ATTENDANCE

- 1 If a student represents the college/University/State/Nation in Sports, NCC, NSS or cultural or any other officially sponsored activities such as College Union/University Union Activities, he/she shall be eligible to claim attendance for the actual number of days participated subject to a maximum of 10 days in a semester based on the recommendations of the teacher in-charge and HoD.
- 2 A student is not eligible for co-curricular leave unless the application for co-curricular leave is submitted within one week.

REGISTRATION FOR EXAMINATIONS

Students of first year Degree, and PG courses are required to submit the following certificates to the office (Examination section) failing which they will not be registered for the ensuing End Semester Examination.

- 1 First Year BA/BSc/BCom: Plus Two/Equivalent examination pass certificate in original. (Students who have passed the examination in more than one attempt need submit the mark list of their last appearance only).
- 2 MA/MSc/MCom: BA/BSc/BCom Degree and mark list in original. Note: Students of the above classes should see that they have sufficient number of true copies of the certificate made, and attested for future use, before they submit the original certificates and mark lists to the office. The above certificates will be returned by the University after verification only by the following September.
- 3 It is mandatory to register for examination to be promoted to the next semester.

IN SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS AND TEST PAPERS

- 1 There shall be a two in semester examinations as per 2015 and 2019 Regulations of the college. The marks obtained for the in semester examinations will be used for calculating the internal marks of the students.
- 2 In addition to these general examinations, special test papers will be given from time to time at the discretion of the teachers after due notice is given to the students.
- 3 Exemption from a general examination is granted only by the principal and application for such exemption must ordinarily be made in person. Before passing orders on the applications the Principal may consult the teachers concerned.
- 4 In case of illness, the Principal may ask for a Medical Certificate from a Govt, registered Medical officer.



- 5 The students are instructed to occupy their respective seats at least 15 minutes before the commencement of the examination.
- 6 Instances of malpractice such as copying using manuscripts, copying from other candidates, smuggling of answer sheets, indecent behavior in the examination hall, use of unfair means, writing on the hall ticket etc are liable to be punished as per the Manual of Examinations of the College.
- 7 Possession of mobile phones or similar electronic devices or resorting to unfair means during examination is considered as a serious malpractice.

FEE STRUCTURE

The tuition fee for the various classes in the college is payable in two equal instalments on elates shown in the fee schedule. The following table shows the fees payable for the various course.

- 1 At the end of the course, the caution deposit will be refunded on receipt of application, after adjusting the dues, if any, on account of (1) loss of library books (2) recovery of fine for breaking laboratory equipment and (3) any other Loss caused to the college.
- 2 Every student should get his/her caution deposit refunded within one month after the completion of his/her course (end of June) producing proper identification and fee receipt of the first installment.
- 3 Fee will not be accepted on any day after 3:00 pm.
- 4 For every payment made to office, a receipt will be issued by the cashier and it should be produced, if any, when called upon to do so.
- 5 Mistakes, if any, on the receipts should be brought to the attention of the office immediately. Complaints made later will not be entertained.

FEE CONCESSION

- 1 Bonafide poor students of backward communities, subject to the rules of Kerala State, are eligible for full fee concession. They will have to produce the necessary nativity certificate and certificate of income in the prescribed form.
- 2 Students belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, OEC including Kudumbi and converts from them are eligible for full fee concession, lumpsum grant for the purchase of books, actual boarding and lodging charges in College Hostels or other Government Hostels from time to time. (This concession shall be granted by the Harijan Welfare Department on applying with necessary certificates at the prescribed time).
- 3 KPCR Scholarship: Students of all communities except SC/ST & OBC are eligible for full fee concession including examination fees provided their family income is within the prescribed limit. Those who wish to avail themselves of this benefit have to submit their applications in the prescribed form at the time of admission. This scholarship has to be renewed yearly.
- 4 Students are encouraged to apply for other scholarships online if they fulfill the required conditions on the respective websites.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

Admission to Library

- 1.1 Entry into the College Library is restricted to the faculty, office staff, students and researchers.
- 1.2 Researchers from other institutions with special permission from the librarian and authorization from their guide also can enrol as members.
- 1.3 Entry into the library must be made using valid College ID card. Cards are not transferable and Should not be passed on to others.
- 1.4 Members of the library must keep their College ID with them when in the library and present them at the request of library staff.

- 1.5 Members should swipe their ID card at the gate entry monitoring system before entering the library.
- 1.6 Personal belongings, mobile phones, text books, printed materials and issued books should not be taken inside the library.
- 1.7 Librarian reserves the right to refuse entry to anyone deemed unfit by demeanour or conduct.
- 1.8 All members should vacate the library promptly at the closing time, or as requested by library staff.

Conduct in the library

- 2.1 Members are expected to respect the library environment as a place of study and conduct themselves with consideration to both library staff and other users.
- 2.2 Refreshment of any kind is not allowed anywhere in the library.
- 2.3 Strict silence must be observed in the library.
- 2.4 Rights of other users of the library should not be breached in any way.
- 2.5 Books taken out of the shelves must be left on the trolley kept nearby. Replacing the documents on shelves by users is not encouraged as they may get misplaced.
- 2.6 Handle the books and journals carefully. Marking with pencil or pen, writing or highlighting, tearing the pages or mutilating the documents\ books in any other way will be dealt with very seriously.
- 2.7 Theft and mutilation of library books are liable to punitive measures by the college authorities.
- 2.8 Users must not disfigure, damage, misuse, shift or remove the property belonging to the library, including furnishings, fittings and equipment.
- 2.9 Use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited.
- 2.10 The distribution of leaflets and display of posters are forbidden without the permission of librarian. Unauthorized materials will be removed immediately.
- 2.11 All library services will be suspended from anyone violating the rules.
- 2.12 Suggestions on all aspects of library services are welcome and they can be posted on the feedback box kept at the entrance of the library.
