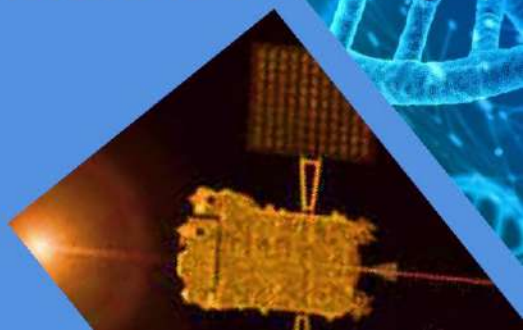

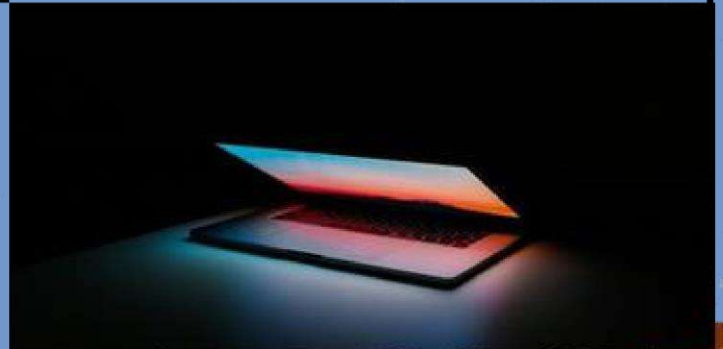

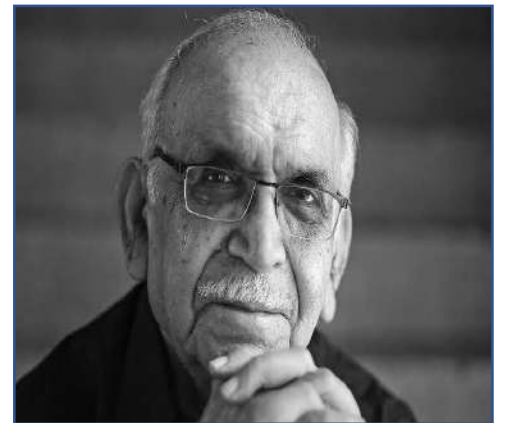

Own-goal gives Croatia a World Cup spot at Russia’s expense

A late own-goal sent Croatia to next year’s World Cup on Sunday in a 1-0 win over Russia.

Croatia bombarded the Russian goal throughout the game — with little success — in search of the win the 2018 runners-up needed to secure the automatic qualifying spot in Group H and consign Russia to the playoffs.

When the breakthrough came in the 81st minute it was from an unexpected source. Croatia’s Borna Sosa hit a cross too deep, evading his teammates, but Russian defender Fedor Kudriashov directed the ball into his own net as he tried to control it.

All of Hesson's predictions came true as India strode into the final with a 70-run victory. Batting first, they scored a mammoth total of 397/4, thanks to Virat Kohli scoring 117 runs off 113 balls and Shreyas Iyer too contributing with a ton. It was a record-setting 50th century in ODIs for Kohli.

Mars disappeared today and it won't come back for two weeks

Hope you said your goodbyes to the red planet because from our viewpoint here on Earth, Mars has disappeared. That is to say, it has disappeared behind the Sun due to the Mars solar conjunction. The conjunction began on November 18 and will only end around two weeks later. The Mars solar conjunction from Earth's perspective happens every two years. Interestingly, the two planets will also be at the farthest from each other during the conjunction. The average distance from Earth to Mars is about 225 million kilometres but during the conjunction, that number may go as high as 400 million kilometres.

SpaceX gets license for second launch of Starship rocket

The Federal Aviation Administration granted Elon Musk's SpaceX on Wednesday a license to launch its massive Starship launch vehicle for a second time after it exploded during its debut test flight in April.

"The FAA has given license authorisation for the second launch of the SpaceX Starship Super Heavy vehicle. The FAA determined SpaceX met all safety, environmental, policy and financial responsibility requirements," said the regulatory authority. SpaceX said it plans to launch during a window that opens at 6.30 PM IST on Friday, November 17.

Watch this Space: NASA stands behind SpaceX, but with bated breath

SpaceX's Starship — the largest launch vehicle ever built in human history — launched on its second-ever flight on Saturday, taking off from the company's Starbase launch facility in Boca Chica, Texas. But shortly after the upper stage separated and reached its target altitude, it went through a "rapid unscheduled disassembly," according to SpaceX. Basically, it exploded.

This was the second test flight for the Starship system. The first one happened in April this year. Even that launch ended in an explosion. I am sure you can see somewhat of a pattern forming. "Such an incredibly successful day. Even though we did have a rapid unscheduled disassembly of both the Super Heavy Booster and the ship," said a SpaceX announcer during a live stream of the launch on Saturday.

SpaceX Starship launch failed minutes after reaching space

SpaceX's uncrewed spacecraft Starship, developed to carry astronauts to the moon and beyond, was presumed to have failed in space minutes after lifting off on Saturday during its second test, after its first attempt ended in an explosion.

The two-stage rocketship blasted off from the Elon Musk-owned company's Starbase launch site near Boca Chica in Texas, boosting the Starship spacecraft roughly 55 miles (90 km) above ground on a planned 90-minute flight into space.

Facebook-parent Meta breaks up its Responsible AI team

Meta has disbanded its Responsible AI division, the team dedicated to regulating the safety of its artificial intelligence ventures as they get developed and deployed, according to a Meta spokesperson.

Most members of the RAI team have been reassigned to the company's Generative AI product division, while some others will now work on the AI Infrastructure team, the spokesperson said. The news was first reported by The Information.

The Generative AI team, born in February, focuses on developing products that generate language and images to mimic the equivalent human-made version. It came as companies across the tech industry poured money into machine learning development so as not to get left behind in the AI race. Meta is among the Big Tech companies that have been playing catch-up since the AI boom took hold.
