

Indian hammer thrower Rachna Kumari banned for 12 years for doping

Indian hammer thrower Rachna Kumari was on Tuesday handed a 12-year ban for failing multiple dope tests by the international federation's Athletics Integrity Unit (AIU). The 30-year-old Kumari's dope sample, taken out-of-competition, was found to contain steroids Stanozolol,

Metandienone,
Dehydrochloromethyltestosterone (DHCMT) and Clenbuterol.

"The AIU has banned Kumari (K.M.) Rachna (India) for 12 years from 24 November, 2023 for the Presence/Use of a Prohibited Substance (Stanozolol, ...



Could a rice-meat hybrid be what's for dinner?

Wednesday, Feb 14, 2024

A new lab-grown meat product merges rice grains with cow cells, scientists report February 14 in Matter. The rice acts as a scaffold that supports the growth of fat or muscle cells. Together, the ingredients form a rice-meat hybrid that steams up to a pinkish-brown mash.

It tasted delicious, "nutty and a little sweet," says Sohyeon Park, a chemical engineer at Yonsei University in Seoul, South Korea. Lab-made beefy rice isn't ready for the dinner table yet, she says, but it could one day offer a more sustainable way to eat meat.

Here's how scientists reached nuclear fusion 'ignition' for the first time

One of nuclear fusion's biggest advances wouldn't have happened without some impeccable scientific artistry.

In December 2022, researchers at Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory in California created fusion reactions that produced an excess of energy — a first. In the experiment, 192 lasers blasted a small chamber, setting off fusion reactions — in which smaller atomic nuclei merge to form larger ones — that released more energy than initially kicked them off (SN: 12/12/22). It's a milestone known as "ignition," and it has been decades in the making.

Feeling February heat? Scientists expect record-breaking temperatures this month Saturday, Feb 17, 2024

Meteorologists predicting are February 2024 is on track to shatter existing heat records due to combination of human-induced global warming and the El Nino climate pattern. Temperature spikes have already reached unprecedented levels. particularly in sea-surface temperatures, and have alarmed the experts.

Dr Joel Hirschi from the UK National Oceanography Centre told The Guardian, "The planet is warming at an accelerating rate, with rapid temperature increases in the ocean, the climate's largest reservoir of heat."

North Korea and Iran using Al for hacking, Microsoft says

US adversaries – chiefly Iran and North Korea, and to a lesser extent Russia and China – are beginning to use generative artificial intelligence to mount or organize offensive cyber operations, Microsoft said on Wednesday.

Microsoft said it detected and disrupted, in collaboration with business partner OpenAI, many threats that used or attempted to exploit AI technology they had developed.

One Tech Tip: Ready to go beyond Google? Here's how to use new generative Al search sites Saturday, Feb 17, 2024

It's not just you. A lot people think Google searches are getting worse. And the rise of generative AI chatbots is giving people new and different ways to look up information.

While Google has been the one-stop shop for decades — after all, we commonly call searches "googling" — its longtime dominance has attracted a flood of sponsored or spammy links and junk content fueled by "search engine optimization" techniques. That pushes down genuinely useful results. A recent study by German researchers suggests the quality of results from Google, Bing and DuckDuckGo is indeed declining.
