Met museum head talks art of repatriation and relevance

It's not easy running one of the world's largest museums with more than 1.5 million works spanning 5,000 years. And certainly not easy amidst heightened scrutiny over looted objects and mounting pressure for repatriation. Max Hollein—who took charge of the Metropolitan Museum of Art (Met), New York as director in 2018 and CEO last July—knows this all too well. Fresh from signing an MoU with India's Ministry of Culture, being "blown away" by the Sanchi Stupa, Jantar Mantar and the Kanheri Caves and ahead of delivering a lecture at the CSMVS on Friday, Hollein remained composed

India's Supreme Court grants protection to filmmaker attacked for movie poster featuring Hindu goddess

A Toronto-based filmmaker from India has been granted protection from India's highest court after facing multiple police investigations and death threats over a depiction of a Hindu goddess on her movie poster.

"I feel really heard," said Leena Manimekalai, who is currently the inaugural artist-in-residence at the Centre for Free Expression at Toronto Metropolitan University (TMU). Manimekalai says she has received thousands of death and rape threats as a result of a movie poster she tweeted promoting her film, Kaali — which uses an alternate spelling of the goddess's name. Stars other than the Sun present in our solar system can have a major impact on the planets including Earth, even possibly changing their orbits, scientists have said. The gravitational pull of the stars has the ability to change the orbit of the Earth, an event that can wreak havoc on the green planet's climate.

The orbital changes happened in the past, millions of years ago. When it happened, the temperature of Earth increased by 8 degrees Celsius, according to the study titled 'Passing Stars as an Important Driver of Paleoclimate and the solar system's Orbital Evolution'.

US spacecraft Odysseus tipped sideways on lunar surface but 'alive & well'

Saturday, Feb 24, 2024

The Houston-based company Intuitive Machines confirmed that the moon lander, Odysseus, is "alive and well" but resting on its side following its historic touchdown on the lunar surface. The spacecraft made headlines as the first private spacecraft to reach the moon and the first from the US since 1972.

The unexpected twist in Odysseus's journey was revealed by the CEO, Stephen Alternus, who explained that a human error led to the failure of the spacecraft's laser-based range finders. Engineers detected the glitch by chance just hours before the scheduled landing time. In a remarkable display of ingenuity, an emergency fix was improvised, saving the mission from a potential crash.

Although the analysis of data indicated that Odysseus tripped over its own feet during the final descent, causing it to land on its side, the spacecraft is reported to be stable near or at the intended landing site, close to the lunar crater Malapert A in the south pole region. Intuitive Machines assured that communication with the lander is ongoing, and commands are being sent from mission control operators. The company aims to obtain the first photo images from the lunar surface at the landing site.

Google Lays Off Thousands More Employees Despite Record Profits One Year After Laying off 12,000 Employees As Workers Begin Worrying Al is Slowly Replacing Them

Google has initiated significant layoffs across its various teams, including the Voice Assistant, hardware, engineering and ad sales teams, marking a continuation of the tech industry's trend towards reducing workforce expenses. The layoffs have affected hundreds of employees within the Voice Assistant unit; hardware teams responsible for Pixel, Nest and Fitbit products; and a considerable portion of the augmented reality (AR) team. This move is part of Google's broader effort to streamline operations and align resources with its most significant product priorities.

According to The Verge, the total number is in the thousands. This comes at a time when Google parent, Alphabet Inc., reported record profits in late January.


