Dr. Pardiwala, the chief medical officer (CMO) of the nearly 120-strong Indian contingent for the Paris Games, said that his 13-member team would render the best possible medical assistance to the contingent in the areas of injury management, sports nutrition, mental conditioning, sports massage, recovery and sleep.

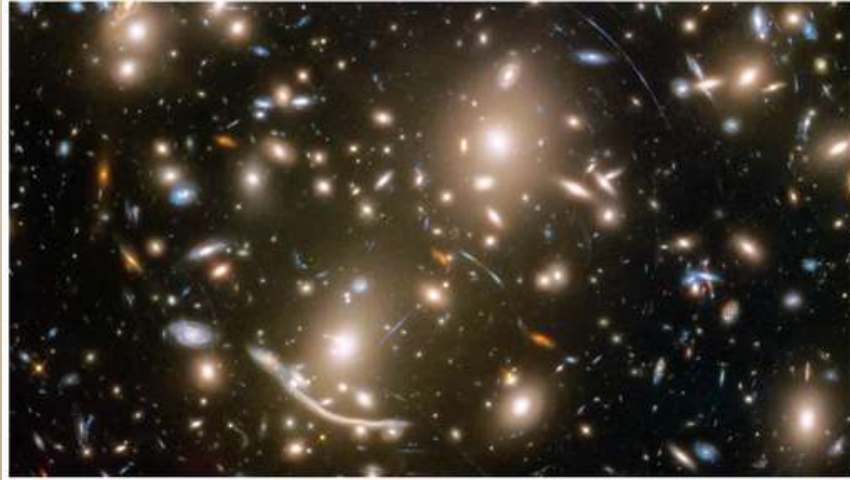

Strange observations of galaxies challenge ideas about dark matter

Head-scratching observations of distant galaxies are challenging cosmologists' dominant ideas about the universe, potentially leading to the implication that the strange substance called dark matter doesn't exist.

That's one possible conclusion from a new study published June 20 in *The Astrophysical Journal Letters*. The finding "raises questions of an extraordinarily fundamental nature," says Richard Brent Tully, an astronomer at the University of Hawaii at Manoa who was not involved in the work.

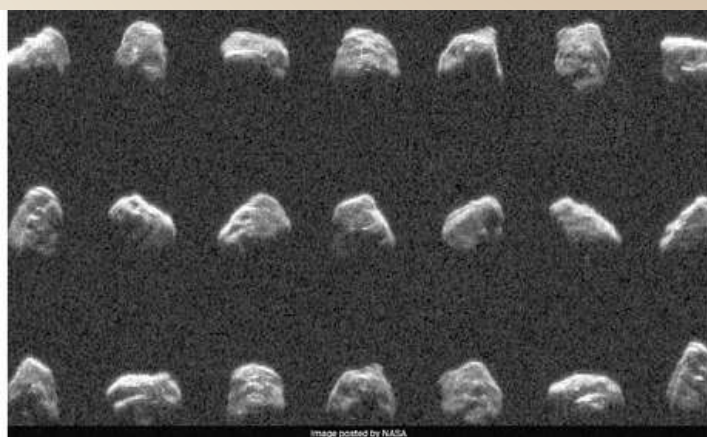
NASA Captures Images Of Large Asteroids That Zipped By Earth

Scientists recently monitored two space rocks zipping by Earth. One surprised them with a tiny moon in tow! NASA keeps a watchful eye on asteroids, constantly tracking their paths to avoid any future collisions. These recent flybys posed no danger, but they offered valuable clues for future preparedness.

Asteroids are leftover debris from our solar system's birth, and studying them is like peering back in time. Their size, orbit, and makeup can reveal secrets about our cosmic neighbourhood.

To track and image these space rocks, [NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory](#) in California used a powerful tool called planetary radar. This system, part of the Deep Space Network, acts like a giant cosmic radar, sending radio waves that bounce off the asteroids and return, creating detailed images.

Taiwan c.bank says no timetable for launching digital currency

Taiwan's central bank said on Sunday that it has no timetable for launching a digital currency, warning the process will be "huge and complex", but it will hold public hearings on the matter next year to spread knowledge.

Taiwan's central bank has been working on a pilot for a government-run digital currency, to allow people to use a digital wallet and make payments without using a debit or credit card.

"Although the bank currently has no timetable for issuing central bank digital currency, in the process of continuous research and experimentation it is already improving the processing efficiency and innovative application of the payment system," it said in a report to parliament.
